
Keeping Las Vegas Moving






Express lanes on a freeway are additional lanes that can be used by drivers who are willing to pay a toll. The toll is collected automatically by an electronic transponder that registers the distance a car travels on the express lanes and deducts the toll from a pre-paid account. Other lanes on that freeway would not have a toll. There are no toll booths to slow traffic.
